Champine – What these are, two homes that had burned in the last year that are eligible for a tax abatement.

Goodenow moved, seconded by Ritter to approve the abatement for Curt and Jeanette Porter of a portion of the taxes payable in 2010 and credit of a portion of the 2011 taxes on parcels that were destroyed by fire in 2010. All voted in favor.

Discussion. Maes – There is a revised one, it is pretty much the same. Nelson moved, seconded by Fenske to approve and authorize the Chair to sign a resolution appointing a county coroner. Fenske – You have talked to Bill about this? Mather – Yes and he is willing to do this. Fenske – Are you going to come back to us with a recommendation on cost? Mather- My budget right now is \$18,000. All voted in favor. (Resolution 36-10 on file in the County Administrator's Office).

Weedman Feedlot Expansion

Biren – They are increasing animal unit numbers by 160. The public hearing was held. We had some members there. A concern with a shallow well upstream and how increasing the number of animals would affect their water. Ritter moved, seconded by Nelson to grant a Conditional Use Permit to Kent and Denise Weedman for a feedlot expansion. The land is zoned agricultural and is described as Southeast Quarter (SE1/4), Section 24, Sodus Township.

Manure to be applied agronomically up to two times a year.

As per recommendation of the Lyon County Planning Commission and the Sodus Township Board. With the following stipulations:

1. That the applicant undertakes the project according to the plans and specifications submitted to the county with the application.
2. That the permit is invalid if the holder has not started construction on the feedlot within a year of the issued land use permit. (A land use permit is valid for one year, and can be renewed administratively for a second consecutive year.)
3. That the county may enter onto the premises at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner to insure the permit holder is in compliance with the conditions and other applicable statutes, rules, and ordinances.
4. Manure in a slurry or liquid form that is being applied in accordance to the manure management plan on file with the MPCA shall be injected or spread and incorporated within 24 hours of spreading except for approved emergency spreading.
5. Manure being hauled on public roads must adhere to policies of the particular road authority involved.
6. The applicant shall obtain all appropriate licenses and permits relevant to the request. Agency involved could be the DNR, MPCA, Board of Animal Health, MDA, MDH, etc.
7. Dead animals shall be disposed of in accordance with the Board of Animal Health Regulations. (Structures used for storing dead animals prior to rendering or structures used for composting shall meet appropriate county and state regulations.)
8. The offset model must indicate 94% annoyance odor free. Any odor control technologies used in the offset model must be in place and maintained.
9. The feedlot shall meet the minimum standards side, rear, and road right of way setbacks, other setbacks, and lot size. Any trees to be planted shall be at least 60 feet from the road right of way.
10. Violations of these conditions or other regulations found in the Lyon County Zoning Ordinance are grounds for enforcement proceedings.
11. A copy of this Motion shall be filed with the County Recorder's Office along with the legal description of the property. Additional fees to be paid by the applicant for the actual costs incurred by the county for the recording fees.

Biren – What I am passing out here is the general NPDES permit they generally have to apply for. The Board's RBA includes the first couple of conditions. Discussion. Nelson – I have a little problem with saturated. If you are going to have that wording in there you are not going to go 50 feet in that field anyway. Discussion. Biren – Number 18, financial assurance. These conditions are specific to this feedlot. Nelson – I think when you are involving a bank to give you a letter of credit for \$15,000 that has the stipulation it can be spent by a third party, what would you think of a banker who would give you that. This is an ongoing letter of credit. Banks have to set aside that money, in this case with it ongoing they also would have to set it aside. If you need to have assurance then it should be the feedlot should agree to pay any costs and if there is a problem there then a lien on the real estate can cover that. Ritter – Having the money available in a fund the person needs to have the ability to access it. Goodenow - A letter of credit is a way of securing it without having it in the hands of the county. You could change the language and have a surety bond. Discussion. Maes – My initial discussion was a bond but we talked about cost. Discussion. Ritter – What do other counties do throughout the state? Biren – Other counties are all over the board on it. We are not setting a precedent. Stensrud- What are your thoughts, do you want to keep it? With a bond option? Discussion. Stensrud asked for public comment. Biren reviewed changes.

Motion by Goodenow seconded by Ritter to amend a Conditional Use Permit to Don DeLanghe filed as Document number 172846 for a feedlot permit (MPCA). Odor OFFSET setback required is 94% from a neighboring dwelling which equals 1334'. The land is zoned agricultural and is described as the East Half of the East Half of the East Half (E1/2E1/2E1/2), Section 31 of Lake Marshall Township. With the following stipulations:

1. The purpose of the manure storage areas is to store the manure from the facility in a manner that is safe to the environment and allows for the proper application of the manure. It is the responsibility of the feedlot owner(s) to insure that the manure storage areas are managed to provide adequate storage. Manure storage must include adequate capacity for the manure production, livestock bedding, runoff from precipitation, and other waste water generated from the feedlot facility. Manure storage shall accommodate for the growing seasons, and adverse manure application seasons. For these reasons the manure storage areas shall be operated in

accordance that is complying with Lyon County's Conditional Use Permit(s), Minnesota Rule Chapter 7020, Minnesota Rule Chapter 7007, Minnesota Statute ch 116, the Code of Federal Regulations Title 40 and the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit.

2. Manure storage areas, includes but is not limited to liquid manure storage basins, manure packs on lots, and offsite temporary and permanent stock piling sites. Manure storage areas must conform to the applicable state rules and statutes and federal code of regulations. These policies rules, regulations and statutes may include but are not limited to water quality standards, erosion control measures, regulations of local and state road authorities, air quality standards, and manure application standards.
3. Manure that is applied in slurry or liquid form must be incorporated or worked into the ground. Exemptions to this requirement would include application of slurry or liquid manure hauled directly from the cattle yards or basins and applied to fallow areas or to perennial crops such as hay or alfalfa during the growing season. The purpose of incorporating the manure or working the manure into the ground is to adequately cover the manure with soil to prevent runoff and to reduce odor emissions. The incorporation or working in of the manure must be completed within twenty four (24) hours of initial manure application. Manure in a solid form must be applied in conformance to the manure application requirements found in Minnesota Rules Chapter 7020 and the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit. Manure that is hauled or transported on public roads must adhere to the policies or laws of the appropriate road authority.
4. Proper analysis of the manure and soil must be completed. A copy of the results of manure and soil analysis must be made available annually to the Lyon County Zoning Office. Manure shall be applied in accordance to manure management requirements found in the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit Minnesota Rules 7020.2225 or as amended. Minnesota Rules 7020.2225 includes: manure nutrient testing requirements, nutrient application rate standards, manure management plan requirements, recordkeeping, manure and process wastewater application requirements in special protection areas, manure and process wastewater application for land within 300 feet of open tile intakes, and manure and process wastewater application near sinkholes, mines, quarries, and wells.
5. As defined by Minnesota Rule Chapter 7020, Minnesota Rule Chapter 7007, Minnesota Statute ch 116, and the Code of Federal Regulations Title 40, manure discharge into waters of the state as a result of manure application manure runoff from the feedlot including the manure basins or from offsite manure stockpiles is strictly prohibited. The definition of water of the state is found in Minnesota Rules 7020.0300 Definitions Subp. 26.
6. The development, maintenance, implementation, and annual updating of the facility's Manure and Nutrient Management Plan (MMP) in accordance with the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit and Minnesota Rules. Require MMP to be prepared and reviewed at least annually by a Minnesota Certified Crop Advisor. Copy of MMP along with annual updates to be give to Lyon County.
7. Record keeping of the two earthen manure storage structures. **Records shall be made available for inspection upon request.** Purpose of keeping records is to monitor the amount of manure storage capacity used and the amount of manure storage capacity available. **Monthly** Reports of the records must be **annually** submitted to Lyon County.
8. Earthen manure storage basins to be physically connected in a manner that allows for the free transfer of manure from one earthen basin to the other **to meet the requirements of the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO Permit.**
9. Surface tile intakes must be identified on the fields that are part of MMP. Surface tile intakes (whether maintained or not) must meet all manure application standards, rules, and regulations.
10. No liquid or solid manure application within 100 feet of any lakes, streams, intermittent streams, drainage ditches without protective berms, or uncultivated wetlands.
11. Manure application on saturated ground **pursuant to the NPDES/SDS CAFO Permit.**
12. Manure application is not allowed if the National Weather Service is predicting a rainfall exceeding 0.5 inches within 24 hours as referenced in the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit.
13. No Manure application allowed on slopes greater than **3 4** percent.
14. No manure application allowed on land not meeting conservation plans required by the Farm Service Agency Office (FSA) or other appropriate future farm agency.
15. Notify both MPCA regional feedlot staff and Lyon County feedlot officer 24-48 hours prior to land application of manure applied in a liquid or slurry form. Notification must include what fields will be involved, how much manure will be applied and references to approved MMP **(referenced in condition 1).**
16. As required by the facilities' NPDES/SDS CAFO permit particularly the emergency response plan component, adequately maintain and make available spill control materials and equipment for response to discharges from any land application sites or manure storage sites.
17. Provide financial assurance for Lyon County to use in the event of a manure release. The financial assurance shall be in the amount of \$15,000.00 and shall be in the form of an irrevocable letter of credit **or a performance bond** for Lyon County to use as needed.
18. In addition to reporting spills or releases to the Minnesota Duty Officer the feedlot owner must also report spills or releases to waters of the state to Lyon County immediately.
19. Adopt Findings of Fact as part of this Motion.
20. A copy of this motion shall be filed with the County Recorder's Office along with the legal description of the property. Additional fees to be paid by Don DeLanghe for the actual costs incurred by the county for the recording fee.

Sick Leave Bank

Stomberg – This was discussed at the last meeting. We are trying to modify the policy so the sick leave bank runs in better harmony with family medical leave. Instead of doubling the amount of time it would be 90 days and only 60 days could run in any rolling period. We would like to change the language on the family medical leave and change that to the rolling. Goodenow moved, seconded by Fenske to approve the policy changes as presented to modify county policy 3250-1 to limit the amount of sick leave available through the Sick Leave Bank to 60 days in any rolling 12 month period up to a lifetime maximum of 90 days and 3246-6 Family Medical Leave to change from a calendar year to a rolling 12 month period to coincide with the Sick Leave Bank, and to have the modifications effective January 1, 2011. Ritter – I appreciate the people that work for the county putting all the time into this. It would be nice to see them come back to the County Board with ways to save money for the tax payers. All voted in favor.

Fenske – Those numbers in here what are they based on? Stomberg – A 4 it is average. Goodenow – I would like to throw out the idea for freezing all elected where they are to help with the budget. Fenske – Does the budget include these? Ritter – The new recorder can't come in a the same salary as the retiring one is going out at. Stomberg – I used \$49,429, which is the minimum that was set.
